Customizing the Header

Once you choose a theme, you'll want to customize the header. You can change the colors of the background and the fonts. Or, you could upload a custom graphic from your computer.

Header Colors



Click the **Header Colors** sublink under the Appearance header in the left sidebar table of links.

Clicking this sublink redirects you to the **Header Colors** page where you can view and change the colors for your header. (These settings only apply to the header provided by the template. If you have uploaded a custom header graphic, most of these settings will have no effect.)

The page shows your current header and a set of tabs to change its appearance. The links are:

Font Color Upper Color Lower Color Revert Advanced Save

Font Color – Clicking this tab displays a color palette. **Hovering** your cursor over areas of the palette causes a long strip of that color to be displayed on the last row of the palette. To the right of the strip is the hex code for the color, i.e. pure red is #FF0000.
